# **Questions & Answers**

### 1. Who is the target audience?

Seventh-day Adventist church members –though all presentations would be perfectly suited to non-member guests as well.

#### 2. How many presentations are included in the seminar?

We make 13 presentations. A 6:30 p.m. starting time for all evening meetings seems to be the most user-friendly for families with children. Our first meeting is on a Friday evening. Except for Saturdays, presentations are given every evening (including Sunday) of the following week. On both Saturdays, we make 3 presentations. After several years of doing this, we have found one during Sabbath school, one during church, and one after a pot luck, to be easiest on attendees.

#### 3. Does the host church need to provide accommodations or meals?

For locations that are within a reasonable driving distance, the Vendens will provide their own meals and stay in their 5th wheel at a nearby campground, RV park, or suitable location. More distant locations may need to provide accommodations and meals.

#### 4. Are there any expenses for the church?

The host church or organization will be responsible for the Venden's driving travel expenses, RV parking, and for the collection of one free-will offering at the end of the seminar (to be sent to North Pacific Union Conference). More distant locations will also be responsible for airfare, a vehicle for transportation, accommodations and meals.

#### 6. Available dates

We are actually booked several years in advance. We file requests in the order in which they are received and communicate with the requesting church when we begin working on the next calendar.
